## 3 FAMOUS PILGRIMAGE SITES DEDICATED TO ST MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

### 1. Mont Saint-Michel, France



Mont Saint-Michel is perhaps the most iconic site associated with St. Michael. Located off the coast of Normandy, this medieval abbey rises dramatically from the sea. According to tradition, in 708 AD, St. Aubert, Bishop of Avranches, received a vision from St. Michael instructing him to build a church on the rocky islet. The first stone church was completed in 714 AD, marking the beginning of a sacred site that would attract pilgrims for centuries.

Over the next several centuries, Mont Saint-Michel underwent significant expansions. The abbey we see today largely took shape from the 10th to the 16th centuries, particularly under the guidance of Abbot Hildebert II, who initiated a grand construction project in 1017. The remarkable architecture features a mix of Romanesque and Gothic styles, culminating in the stunning flamboyant choir completed in 1520.

### 2. Sanctuary of St. Michael, Italy



The Sanctuary of St. Michael, also known as the Sanctuary of Monte Sant'Angelo, is located in the Apennine Mountains of Italy. Its origins trace back to a vision experienced by a local nobleman, Gargano, in 490 AD, when St. Michael appeared in a cave and instructed him to build a church in his honor. This led to the construction of the church, completed in the 6th century. The sanctuary became an important center for Christian pilgrims in Southern Italy.

The church is renowned for its stunning Romanesque architecture and its intricate stone carvings.

Over the centuries, it has been expanded and renovated, preserving its historical and spiritual significance.

### 3. Michael's Mount, England



Michael's Mount is a tidal island located off the coast of Cornwall. Its history as a pilgrimage site dates back to the early medieval period, with the first church reportedly built in the 12th century. Legend holds that the archangel appeared to a local fisherman in 495 AD, leading to the island's dedication to him. The current castle and chapel were constructed in the 14th century, showcasing a mix of Gothic and medieval architectural styles.

The causeway connecting the island to the mainland becomes accessible during low tide, allowing pilgrims to walk across the sea, symbolizing their spiritual journey.
