SAINT OF THE WEEK<br/>St Alphonsus Rodriguez<br/>(Feast day: 30th Oct) $\checkmark$  $\checkmark$ </t

Saint Alphonsus Rodriguez, born in 1531 in Segovia, Spain, came from a prosperous family. He was the third of eleven children. At age eleven, Alphonsus began studies at a newly established Jesuit college, where he was eager to serve the Jesuits, who had once lodged in his family's country home during a mission. Unfortunately, his education was cut short by the death of his father, forcing him to assume family responsibilities. In 1557, Alphonsus married and had three children. However, his life took a tragic turn when, within five years, his wife and two of his children died, leaving him to care

for his young son alone. Deeply affected by these losses, Alphonsus turned to God, seeking to atone for his sins and dedicating himself to a life of penance. When his last surviving child died, Alphonsus saw this as a sign to further detach himself from earthly concerns and commit to a deeper spiritual path.

Seeking guidance, he went to Valencia, where a Jesuit priest whom he admired helped him develop a trusting relationship with God. At thirty-eight, he sought admission to the Jesuit Order but was initially rejected due to insufficient education and fragile health, affected by his austere lifestyle. He spent two years as a tutor before finally being accepted into the Order. His religious life was characterized by humble service as a porter at a Jesuit college in Majorca, where he embraced even the most menial tasks. Alphonsus faced numerous spiritual and physical trials, including demonic attacks and illnesses, but his steadfast love for Jesus and devotion to the Cross strengthened him. Twice he was thrown down a cement staircase by demonic forces, yet he remained resilient in his faith.

By 1591, at the age of sixty, he was instructed to sleep in a bed, having previously rested only briefly on a table or chair. He also assisted at a chapel where elderly priests celebrated Mass. His writings, particularly his maxims, reflected a deep humility, often comparing himself to a donkey that patiently bears burdens in silence. He found joy in accepting public reproaches and maintained a quiet endurance throughout his life.

In his later years, Alphonsus formed a significant bond with Saint Peter Claver, then a novice, and foresaw his future missionary work through a vision. Their association became legendary, and both were canonized together by Pope Leo XIII in 1888. Alphonsus passed away in 1617, already revered for his sanctity. He was beatified in 1825, and after the verification of two miracles, he was officially canonized. His legacy remains a testament to the transformative power of suffering, humility, and selfless love in the Christian life, embodying the enduring value of the Cross in the spiritual journey.

Plenary indulgence is granted each day from November 1-8 for those who vist the cemetery and pray for the holy souls.
