

* * * * * THE HOLY CLOAK OF * * * * *ST JOSEPH



The tradition of St. Joseph's holy mantle is rooted in an ancient story passed down through oral tradition. It is said that St. Joseph, known for his deep faith and righteousness, intercedes for those who seek his help. Among his devotions, the novena of the "Holy Mantle of St. Joseph" is well known, inspired by an event that transformed lives.

The story begins when St. Joseph needed to retrieve timber from Hebron but only had half the

payment. His wife, the Virgin Mary, suggested leaving his mantle as a pledge to the merchant, Ishmael. Despite Ishmael's miserly nature, he reluctantly accepted Joseph's wedding mantle as security for the remaining debt. However, an astonishing series of miracles soon followed.

Ishmael had long suffered from ulcers in his eyes, which no doctor could heal. The morning after receiving Joseph's mantle, his sight was miraculously restored. His wife, Eve, known for her fierce and quarrelsome temperament, suddenly became gentle and peaceful. Recognizing the change in their home, Ishmael wondered if Joseph's mantle was responsible.

Further miracles confirmed his suspicions. When their best cow fell gravely ill, Ishmael placed the mantle over it, and the animal was instantly healed. That night, a fire threatened to consume his father's house, but when a piece of the mantle was thrown into the flames, the fire was extinguished without water.

Realizing the divine blessings associated with the mantle, Ishmael and Eve traveled to Nazareth to express their gratitude to Joseph and Mary. They presented gifts—white lambs and pigeons for Jesus, oil and honey for Mary, and a new finely woven mantle for Joseph. Ishmael confessed how the mantle had changed his life: he was once a greedy moneylender, his wife was filled with anger, but now they lived in peace and prosperity.

Moved by their transformation, Joseph allowed them to keep the mantle, and Mary assured them that all families who placed themselves under Joseph's protection would receive God's blessings. She encouraged them to love and serve Joseph, to wear the mantle, and to share its graces with their children.

Following Mary's advice, Ishmael and his family lived in happiness, and future generations continued to experience the blessings of St. Joseph's protective mantle. This story remains a powerful testament to St. Joseph's intercession, encouraging devotion to his care and trust in his fatherly protection.
