***** THE POWER OF CHRIST'S *** RESURRECTION



The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ is the heart of the Christian faith. It is not merely an event in history—it is the very reason we are Christians. If someone were to ask why we follow Christ, the most powerful and truthful response would be: because we believe in the Risen Lord. As the Acts of the Apostles tells us, "With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great favor was accorded them all" (Acts 4:33). The Resurrection is the source of that great power—a power that continues to transform lives, strengthen the faithful, and sustain the

Church through every age.

Jesus' words to Martha—"I am the Resurrection and the Life" (John 11:25)—are deeply consoling. He doesn't say merely that He will rise, or that He gives life; He identifies Himself as the very source of life itself. Just as He called Lazarus from the tomb, so too He calls each of us from spiritual death to new life in Him. This truth, when meditated upon, stirs our hearts and lifts our minds to Heaven. The Risen Christ is not distant or abstract—He is with us, pouring out grace upon grace, giving us strength to carry our crosses, and promising that death will never be the final word.

More than a miraculous event, the Resurrection is a saving event. As St. Paul teaches, "He was delivered over to death for our sins and raised to life for our justification" (Romans 4:25). Through His Resurrection, Jesus has opened the way for us to be reconciled with God and filled with new life. In Baptism, we are united with Christ's death and Resurrection, dying to sin and rising with Him in grace. As the Catechism says, "By His Resurrection, He opens for us the way to a new life" A life of justification, adoption, and participation in the divine nature.

The Resurrection also brings about the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Raised by the power of the Spirit, Christ now sends that same Spirit upon His Church. As Paul writes, "If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, then He who raised Christ will also give life to your mortal bodies" (Romans 8:11). It is this Spirit that empowers us to live holy lives and bear witness to Christ in a world so often marked by despair and darkness.

The Eucharist, too, is intimately connected with the Resurrection. In the Holy Mass, we receive the glorified, risen Lord—body, blood, soul, and divinity. The Eucharist is not simply a remembrance of past events; it is a living encounter with the Risen Christ, who nourishes us with His very life.

As we reflect on the Resurrection, may we be filled with renewed hope. Let this truth deepen our faith, strengthen our witness, and prepare us for the eternal joy of being raised with Christ on the last day.

Christ has risen, let us rejoice and be glad! Alleluia! Alleluia!
