Feast day: (20<sup>th</sup> May)



In 1408, during a sermon, the great missionary St. Vincent Ferrer paused to declare that among his audience was a young Franciscan who would surpass him in preaching and be honored in the Church before him. That friar was Bernardine of Siena, only 28 years old at the time.

Born of noble parents in Italy, Bernardine showed early signs of holiness. During a plague in Siena, he devoted himself to caring for the sick, risking his life

devoted himself to caring for the sick, risking his life out of love for Christ. At age 24, he entered the Franciscan Order. Though initially hindered by a speech defect, Bernardine's preaching mission truly began after he was miraculously healed through the

intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1417.

From that moment on, his voice rang with power and clarity across Italy. He was a fiery preacher, gifted with the ability to move hearts and convert entire towns. Though he preached in Italian, even Greeks who knew only their native tongue could understand him - a grace attributed to the Holy Spirit. He traveled extensively on foot, reforming both religious and civil life, urging repentance, and spreading devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. At the end of his sermons, he would raise a tablet bearing the monogram "IHS," a symbol of Christ's Name, which many began to venerate. He also promoted devotion to St. Joseph at a time when it was little known.

Bernardine was so devoted to preaching that for sixteen years - some say eighteen - he preached every single day. His extraordinary influence drew criticism. He was once accused of heresy because of his popular promotion of the Holy Name, but after careful examination, he was vindicated and publicly defended by the Pope.

Despite being offered several bishoprics, including Siena, Bernardine humbly refused them all, choosing instead to continue his preaching mission. He also performed many miracles, healing the

sick and even raising the dead through the power of Christ.

In 1438, he was made Vicar General of the Franciscan Order, leading with wisdom and zeal. After five years, he stepped down and resumed his itinerant preaching until his health declined. On the eve of the Ascension in 1444, while his fellow friars chanted the words, "Father, I have manifested Thy Name to men," Bernardine passed peacefully into eternal life.

His holiness was recognized swiftly. Just six years later, in 1450, during a Jubilee Year, Pope Nicholas V canonized him. Later, in 1721, Pope Innocent XIII extended the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus, which Bernardine had tirelessly promoted, to the entire Church. St. Bernardine remains a model of passionate love for Christ, humble

service, and bold evangelization.
