INSTRUCTIONS FOR RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Only **CATHOLICS** in the state of grace (i.e., no mortal sin) may receive Holy Communion. Communion is given on the **TONGUE** only.

When receiving:

- (1) If physically able, kneel reverently to receive.
- (2) Open your mouth and extend your tongue so the priest can place the Host without touching your lips or tongue.
- (3) Close your eyes and receive with reverence.
- (4) Remain still and do not rush.
- (5) It is recommended not to chew the Host; let it dissolve in your mouth.
- (6) Ensure the Host is fully in your mouth before returning to your seat.
- (7) Return to your seat, kneel, and give thanks to God.

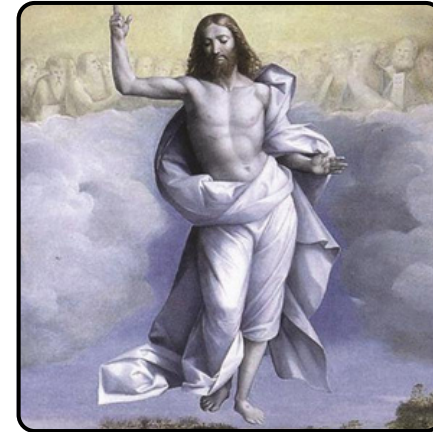

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St Ubaldu



St Ubaldu was born of noble parents in the city of Gubbio, in Umbria, Italy, at the beginning of the twelfth century. From an early age, his life was marked by both privilege and trial. While still very young, he lost his father, and this loss shaped the course of his upbringing. He was entrusted to the care of the prior of the cathedral church of Gubbio, where he received his education and formation. It was in this environment that his vocation began to take root, and he eventually became a canon regular attached to the cathedral.

Even in his youth, Ubaldu showed a deep desire for a more disciplined and devoted religious life. Seeking greater regularity in serving God, he left the cathedral community and entered the Monastery of Saint Secondo in Gubbio. There he lived for several years, dedicating himself to prayer, penance, and the observance of religious life. However, his bishop later recalled him to the cathedral, where he was appointed prior. This position of responsibility did not diminish his desire for holiness, but rather gave him the opportunity to influence others.

Hearing of a particularly fervent community of canons regular established at Vienna by Blessed Peter de Honestis, Ubaldu travelled there to observe their way of life. He remained for three months, carefully studying their statutes and practices, which had been approved by Pope Paschal II. Upon returning to Gubbio, he introduced these reforms among his own community, helping to renew their religious life with greater discipline and devotion.

Ubaldu lived a life of remarkable virtue. Though he came from a wealthy background, he gave away his entire patrimony to the poor and to the restoration of monasteries. He embraced poverty, humility, and mortification, and was known for his meekness and fervour. His holiness became widely known, and several bishoprics were offered to him, all of which he humbly refused.

Eventually, however, when the episcopal see of Gubbio became vacant, the people themselves chose him and sent him to Pope Honorius II to request a new bishop. The Pope, recognising his virtue, consecrated Ubaldu and sent him back as bishop of his own city. As bishop, he became a model shepherd, guiding his people not only in spiritual matters but also protecting them in times of need.

After a long illness lasting two years, he died in 1168, on the feast of Pentecost. His life was marked by holiness, and many miracles were attributed to him both during his lifetime and after his death. He was canonised by Pope Celestine III in 1192. His intercession became especially known for protection against evil spirits.

His body, found incorrupt, was later placed in a church built in his honor on a hill overlooking Gubbio. To this day, he remains a beloved patron of the region, with strong devotion among the people, who continue to honor him with great solemnity.
